## Nature Areas in Cerro Gordo County

#### McIntosh Woods State Park

Lakeshore & woods with hiking trails and picnic areas. Just east of Ventura on Clear Lake's North Shore Drive.

#### > Ventura Marsh

Wetland & grassland, on the west end of Clear Lake at Ventura. Go west of Ventura on North Shore Drive, or south of Ventura on County Road S14.

#### Zirbel Slough

Prairie marsh. 5 miles south of Clear Lake on Highway 107, then 1 mile east on 200<sup>th</sup> Street.

#### Shellrock River Greenbelt

Woods, meadows, ponds, river bluffs and picnic areas to drive or hike through. Follow signs from US Highway 18 West of Nora Springs. Connects to

Wilkinson Pioneer Park on the north, at the south edge of Rock Falls on County Road B-20, or from 295<sup>th</sup> Street.

#### > Lime Creek Nature Center

Forest, prairie and river bluff hiking trails and a nature center with bird feeders, displays and library. The center is wheelchair accessible. Just north of Mason City on US Highway 65, the first right turn after the railroad overpass. (641) 423-5309
